



Brukungu Mine Rehabilitation

Stakeholder engagement review



Jensen Planning + Design was engaged by the Department of Primary Industries and Resources (Minerals and Energy Division) to provide an independent review of the stakeholder engagement and consultation processes undertaken on the rehabilitation of a closed mine, and to provide advice on an appropriate stakeholder consultation plan to achieve a successful mine closure strategy.

Through desktop research and a series of interviews with key people, Jensen Planning + Design was able to provide a synopsis of the consultation processes employed, and the various contextual influences (political, legislative etc) affecting the consultation approach. The stakeholder engagement processes were then assessed against a range of indicators to determine whether they were appropriate and based on sound principles, having reference to best practice consultation approaches and the Government requirements at the time.

The Jensen Planning + Design team drew on its experience in the areas of community engagement, social and environmental impact assessment and environmental policy to develop a number of recommendations, based on the results of the gap analysis undertaken on previous consultation as well as recognised best practice approaches towards consultation on mining operations.
